

3-95 Antipsychotics and time of onset

TIPS Question:

As psychotropics take a long time to take effect in elderly, are there other therapies (meds) that have a shorter action time until the antipsychotics kick in?

Response:

Time of onset varies in respect to your target symptoms. Sedation may occur in terms of hours while decreasing the psychosis may take weeks.

I wish there were faster means (drugs) in dealing with the psychosis but to my knowledge, there is not. However, your support, ability to provide a structured, secure environment, eliminating other contributors in the environment or eliminating physical causes and medication contributing to the problems can and will be critical.
