How Long?

COVID 19 has done something funny with my mental calendar. As I write this it is only seven months until Christmas, yet I sometimes feel that we have not even started 2020. For some reason I thought that the pandemic would be short lived, a week maybe three. However, a question that I and possibly you wrestle with is When will this be over? When can we be back to normal? This are similar questions that were asked during the Old Testament times of Jeremiah and the Babylonian exile. The question of When will this be over? When can we be free?

In Jeremiah 33 we are reminded, within the context of captivity and lockdown, there is an anticipation that the sounds of festival celebration will again be heard.

“Give thanks to the LORD of hosts, for the LORD is good, for his steadfast love endures forever! (Jeremiah 33:11)

Yet the prophecy does not intend a return to “the good old days” or a restoration of normal. The promise is a return to a land where we see the goodness of God lived out in renewed and refreshed ways. This is God’s manner of restoration, just like the promise of Easter, God does not quit even in the face of death. God is always renewing a redeeming He has not left is nor abandoned us.

We are also reminded of the thanksgiving hymn, “Now Thank We All Our God” written by Pastor Martin Rinkart during the Thirty Years War (1618–1648). Martin Rinkart was pastor in the walled city of Eilenburg, Saxony. The city was a refuge for many fleeing war and pestilence. He remained as the only pastor in the town, he often burying as many as forty or fifty persons in one day. It was in the midst of this terrible times he wrote the hymn, as a table grace for his family.

We have two point of action from these examples. First is to engage in relentless, unbending courage. With the conviction that God will not quit until God has complete what He has purposed. Secondly, to be witnesses to the faithful love of God that endures amid epidemics. We are reminded to remind others that even in the midst of abandonment, God has not abandoned. We do this through by neighborly generosity and hospitality and celebrate goodness as it appears among us. Like Pastor Rinkart and his willingness to sing and pray, even with death as close as his own household. That faith does not yield to death because it knows in the deepest ways that the goodness of God will not fold in the face of the threat of death.
